**Staff Report Summary**

This report analyzes amendment options to Battle Ground Municipal Code pertaining to the sale and discharge of consumer fireworks.

**Background**

At councils' request, staff has conducted an analysis of current regulations, potential changes, and impacts of Battle Ground Municipal Code 8.30 – Fireworks and Explosives.

**Current Restrictions**

Currently, the City of Battle Ground has no fireworks ordinances that are more restrictive than state law.

Battle Ground sale dates, discharge dates, and permissible firework types are listed below:

**Types of fireworks:**

Consumer fireworks are permitted provide they meet the definition below.

"Consumer fireworks" means any small firework device designed to produce visible effects by combustion and which must comply with the construction, chemical composition, and labeling regulations of the United States consumer product safety commission, as set forth in 16 C.F.R. Parts 1500 and 1507 and including some small devices designed to produce audible effects, such as whistling devices, ground devices containing 50 mg or less of explosive materials, and aerial devices containing 130 mg or less of explosive materials and classified as fireworks UN0336 by the United States department of transportation at 49 C.F.R. Sec. 172.101 as of June 13, 2002, and not including fused set pieces containing components which together exceed 50 mg of salute powder. (RCW 70.77.136)

Sale and use of certain fireworks is prohibited.

No fireworks may be sold or offered for sale to the public as consumer fireworks which are classified as sky rockets, or missile-type rockets, firecrackers, salutes, or chasers as defined by the United States department of transportation and the federal consumer products safety commission except as provided in RCW 70.77.311. (RCW 70.77.401)

**Examples of Legal Consumer Fireworks:**

- Reloadable Mortars
- Roman Candles
- Mines / Shells / Cakes
- Helicopters / Aerial Spinners
- Parachutes
- Fountains
- Ground Spinners
- Wheels
- Sparklers
- Smoke devices

### **Examples of Illegal Fireworks:**

- Firecrackers
- Salutes
- Chasers
- Skyrockets
- Bottle rockets
- M-80s
- M-1000s
- Homemade devices

(Some of these types of fireworks may be purchased in other states or on some tribal reservations, but are illegal in Washington State or outside of a reservation.)

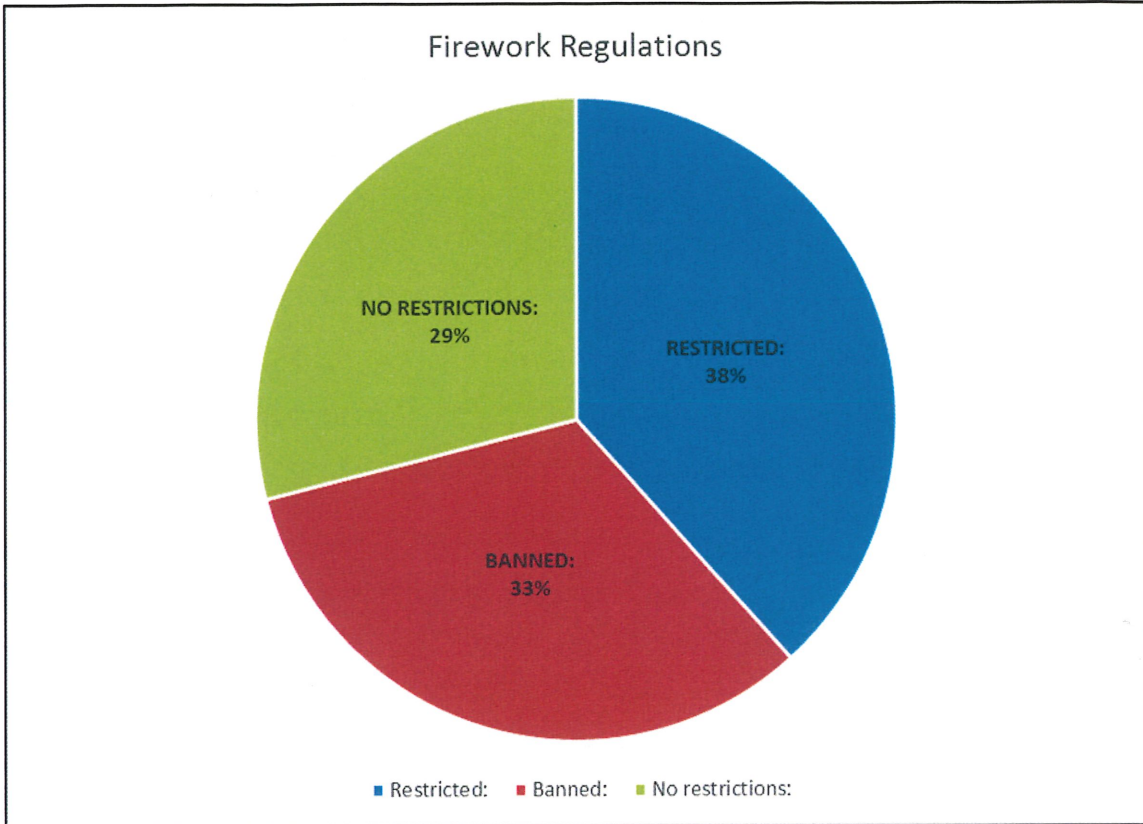

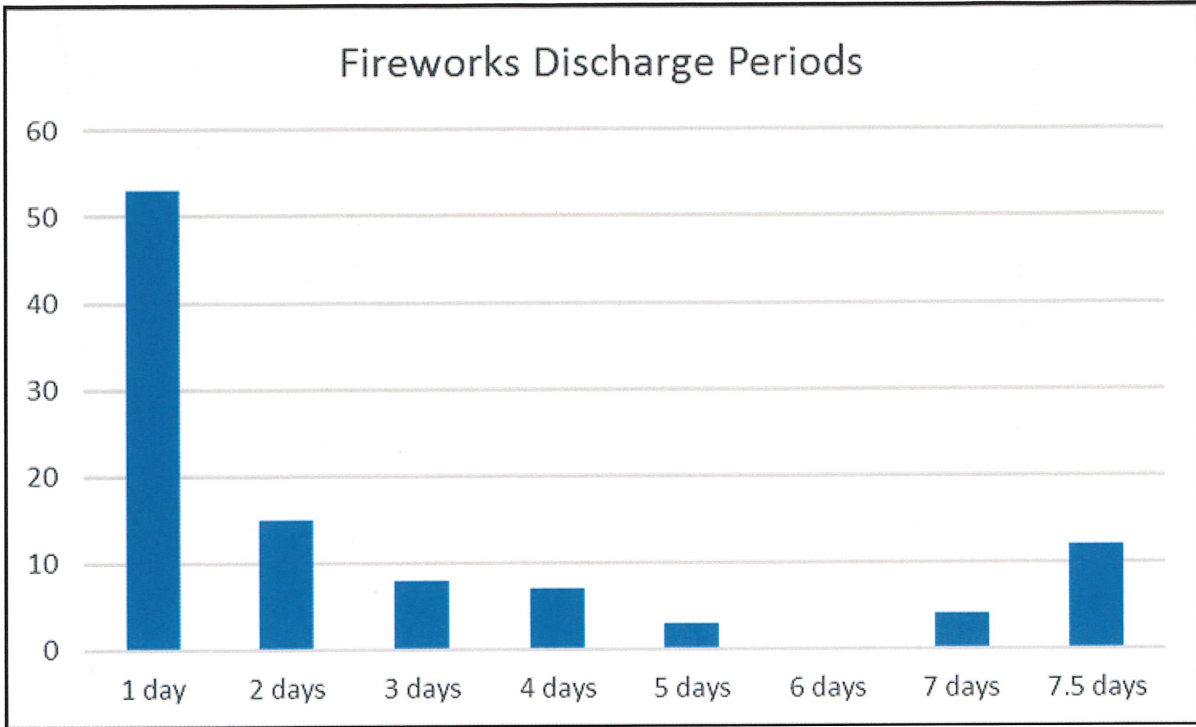




Of the (102) Washington State Jurisdictions that have implemented regulations, most have done so by decreasing the amount of days that fireworks can be discharged.

\*7.5 days refer to Jurisdictions who follow State Law with the exception of a narrower discharge time on July 5.



Currently, (4) jurisdictions in Washington State have restricted fireworks discharge to non-aerial type only. These include Washougal, Snoqualmie, Soap Lake, and Okanogan.

**Process**

Under RCW 70.77, State law governs the regulation of fireworks, including which fireworks are legal, licensing for public fireworks displays and for fireworks sellers, and when fireworks may be discharged. However, it leaves some room for local regulation, such as when fireworks may be sold or discharged, what types of fireworks may be sold or discharged, and for cities and counties to completely prohibit the sale and discharge of fireworks.

In accordance with RCW 70.77.250(4), any local fireworks ordinances that are more restrictive than state law may not take effect until at least one year after adoption.

**Fiscal and Policy Implications**

Staff has analyzed how the modifying Battle Ground fireworks ordinances impact affect the City, both from an economic standpoint and a services standpoint.

**City Services**

**Community Development Department**

Current fireworks stand permit holders renew their permits annually and pay a permit fee of \$100.00. (This amount is the maximum allowed by the State under RCW 70.77.555). There are currently seven permit holders for locations in Battle Ground.

## **Public Works**

The biggest impact to Public Works is the increased dump fees associated with the additional trash in the street as well as the additional work involved with cleaning out the stormwater catch basins that collect the remnants of the fireworks.

## **Police / Code Enforcement**

Any regulations on fireworks imposed that are more restrictive than current code would likely increase the need for enforcement outside of permissible discharge curfew dates and times.

Training to officers on the new ordinance and types of fireworks would be required.

Adequate staffing to provide enforcement as directed by the Council and City Manager would be needed. More letter of the law enforcement would require officers on overtime as enforcement creates more paperwork and takes units out of service for longer periods. This required additional staffing to respond to other calls for service not related to fireworks.

## **Fire / Emergency Services**

Any regulations on fireworks imposed that are more restrictive than current code would likely reduce the number of fire and medical responses by the Fire District. A narrower window of legal discharge times would allow enhanced staffing levels for a targeted time period, rather than remaining on high alert for up to eight consecutive days.

Under current conditions, emergency resources occupied on fireworks discharge calls may be unable to provide the expected level of response to other calls for service unrelated to fireworks in the community.

## Staff Recommendation

Conduct a survey to determine public opinion regarding potential fireworks ordinances. Revisit fireworks ordinance at council meeting on 5/07/2018, at which point survey results will be available.

**How to Read the Chart**

- **Restricted** — The jurisdiction has restricted either the **Sales Period** and/or **Discharge Period**. If only one column has dates and times, it only applies to that period. The other period follows the State Law. If there are dates and times in both, then both are restricted.
- **Banned** — The jurisdiction has banned both the Sales and Discharge of fireworks.

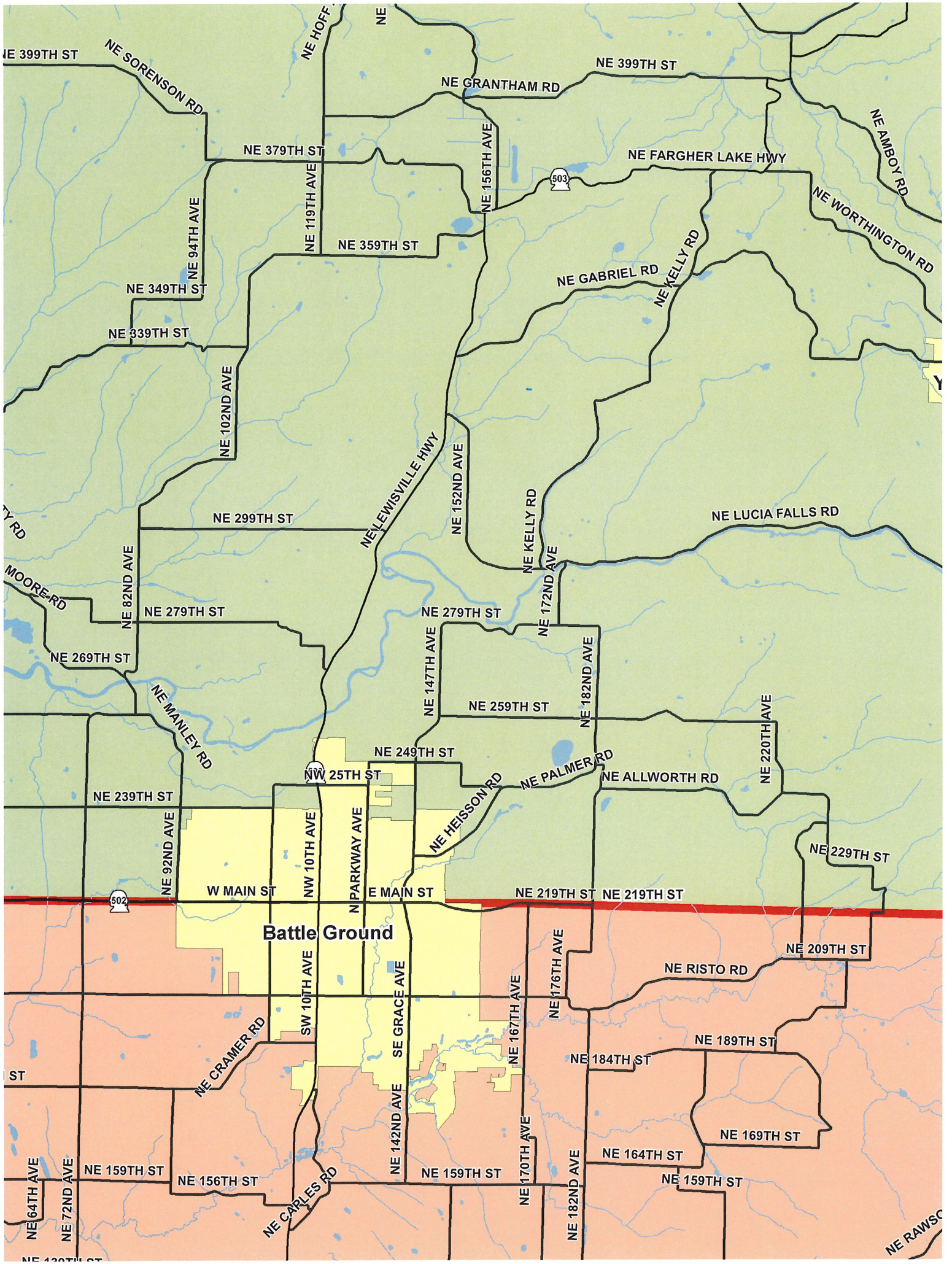

### Cylindrical Fountain

Upon ignition, a shower of colored sparks, and sometimes a whistling effect, is produced.



### Helicopters, Aerial Spinners

A propeller or blade is attached, which, upon ignition, lifts the rapidly spinning device into the air. A visible or audible effect is produced at the height of flight.



### Cone Fountain

Upon ignition, a shower of colored sparks, and sometimes a whistling effect, is produced.



### Smoke Devices

Tube or sphere containing pyrotechnic composition that, upon ignition, produces a white or colored smoke as a primary effect.



### Roman Candles

Heavy paper or cardboard tube containing pyrotechnic composition. Upon ignition, up to ten "stars" are individually expelled at several-second intervals.



### Parachutes

Upon ignition, one or more parachutes are propelled into the air with stars, smoke, and other effects being discharged as the parachute floats downward.



### Wheels

Pyrotechnic device attached to a post or tree by means of a nail or string. A wheel may contain up to six "driver" units; upon ignition, the wheel revolves, producing a shower of color and sparks and, sometimes, a whistling effect.



### Mine/Shells/Cakes

Mine – An aerial device that shoots stars into the sky in an upward spray pattern.  
Shell – A shell is an aerial item that is fired into the sky.  
Cake – Dense-packed collection of mine/shell tubes that are fused together.



### Ground Spinners

A small device similar to a wheel in design and effect. When placed on the ground and ignited, a shower of sparks and color is produced by the rapidly spinning device.



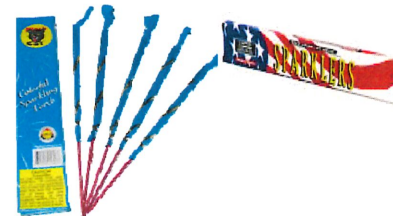
### Reloadable Mortars

A shell consisting of a container, a lift charge, a time fuse, a burst charge, and stars/effects. The lift charge propels the shell out of the tube igniting the burst charge at the right altitude, igniting the effects.



### Dipped Stick, Sparkler

Stick or wire coated with pyrotechnic composition that produces a shower of sparks upon ignition. Total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed 100 grams per item.



### Novelties

"Trick and Novelty Devices" means any small firework device not classified as a Consumer of Display Firework. Items contain a small amount of pyrotechnic composition that is friction sensitive.

## FIREWORK AND EXPLOSIVE DEVICES THAT ARE ILLEGAL IN WASHINGTON STATE

**Federally Legal Consumer Fireworks:** These items are legal to purchase, possess, and discharge only at an Indian Reservation. Possession and/or use off the reservation is illegal.

### Firecrackers

Generally 1/4" x 1 1/2" or less that come in packs to large bricks. A firecracker makes a single "pop" sound. Many firecrackers strung together will make repetitive "popping" sounds.



### Sky Rockets and Missiles

Similar to the Bottle Rocket, a Sky Rocket is attached to a stick or has fins and may have a plastic cap. A missile will have fins rather than a stick. Once lit, it ascends rapidly, high into the air where it explodes.



### Bottle Rockets

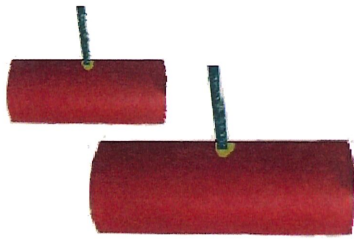
A firecracker type (tube) attached to a 12" long wooden stick. The stick is placed in a bottle and once lit, it rises into the air, travelling laterally before exploding.



**Illegal Explosive Devices:** The possession, manufacturing, or using of illegal Explosive Devices is a criminal offense.

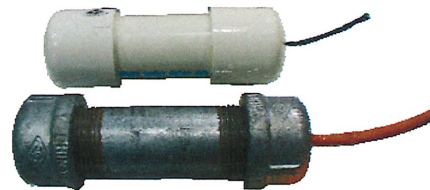
### M-80's, M-100's, etc.

Illegal since the 70's, an M-80 can contain flash powder, black powder, or a composition of materials that are sensitive to shock and can injure or kill people. Can do serious permanent damage to fingers, hands, and eyes.



### Improvised Explosive Device (IED)

A pipe bomb is an improvised explosive device, consisting of a tightly sealed section of pipe that is filled with an explosive material. The pipe provides containment, meaning that a low explosive can be used to produce a relatively large explosion.

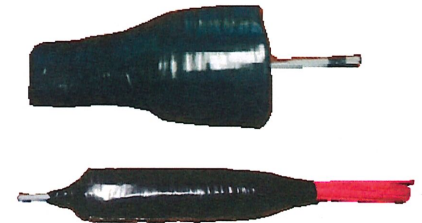


A tennis ball bomb is an improvised explosive device consisting of a tennis ball filled with combustibles or pyrotechnic material with a fuse producing a loud explosion.



### Altered Firework

Sparklers are bound together in electrical or duct tape to contain the ignition of the sparklers, providing for a loud "whoomp" sound with a flash of light.



## Sample Ordinance – Emergency Ban

### **Emergencies – Restrictions on Use.**

The City Council, after consulting with The Fire Chief, Fire Marshal, and other officials as may be deemed appropriate, may prohibit the discharge of all fireworks during periods of extreme fire danger. For the purpose of this Chapter, the term “extreme fire danger” shall mean a period of hot, dry weather, accompanied by low fuel moistures. It is during this period that wild land fires can be expected, and fire growth will be accelerated.



## Sample Ordinance – Safe and Sane Fireworks

### **Sale and discharge of certain fireworks prohibited.**

Within the city, licensed retailers may sell and the members of the public may discharge only non-aerial fireworks. Fireworks which explode, fly into the air, or travel more than 6 feet on the ground or 12 inches into the air are not permitted.

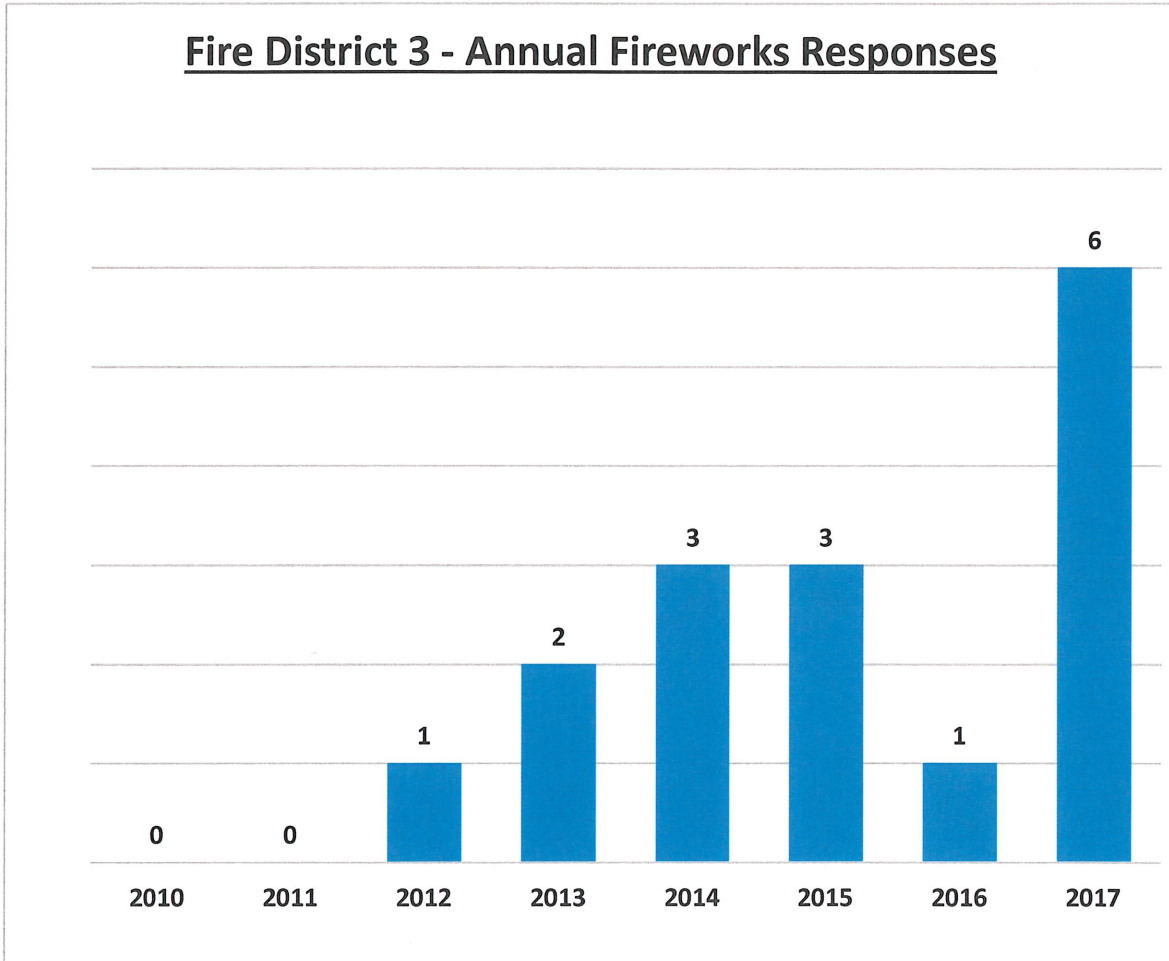
Legal fireworks include Cone Fountains, Cylindrical Fountains, Flitter Sparklers, Ground Spinners, Illuminating Torches, and other similar items.

Novelty Items that produce only smoke or ash or make a small noise are permitted. Novelty items include Smoke Bombs, Party Poppers, Snakes, etc.

The following chart shows the number of fireworks calls for Fire District 3 and Battle Ground since 2010:

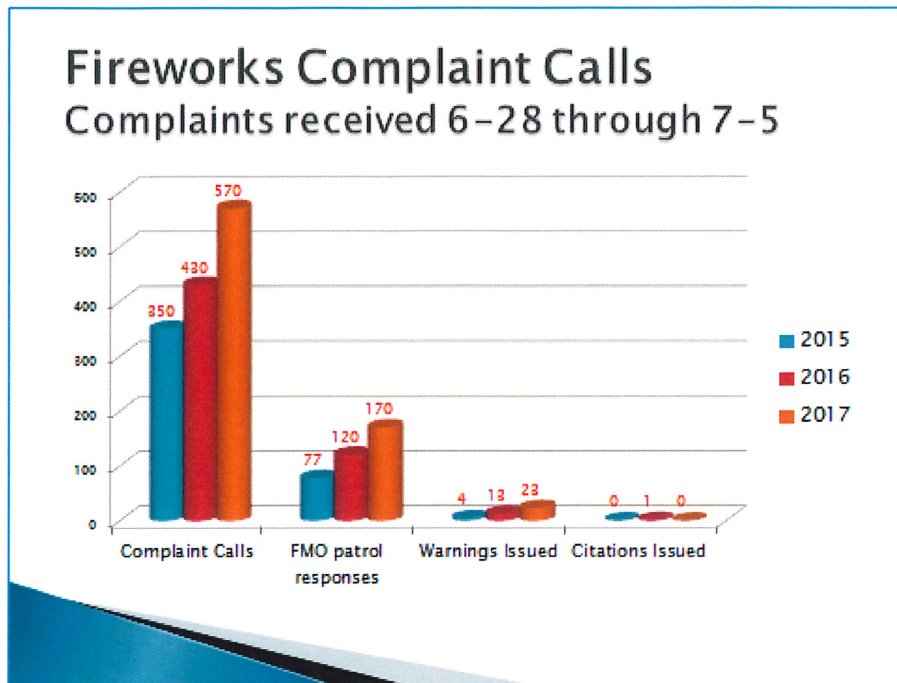


(The majority of these fire incidents involved vegetation fires caused by fireworks with noted damage to grass, brush, trees, and fences.)

- ▶ Fire incidents generally involved vegetation (grass, brush, decorative hedges)
- ▶ 2016
  - 31 Fire Incidents
    - One involved a structure where the roof collapsed, injuring a firefighter
- ▶ 2017
  - 28 Fire Incidents
    - One igniting decorative hedge that significantly damaged a residence
    - One igniting the exterior of a home due to improperly disposed fireworks

- ▶ 2015
  - 22 Injuries
- ▶ 2016
  - 18 Injuries (reported by hospitals)
