

## DONALD LEWIS SAHOTA July 18th, 1969 — January 29th, 2022

Don Sahota (52) died protecting his family and community on Saturday, January 29th. He married his high school sweetheart Dawnese on August 18th, 1999 and had children Kylie and Colton in 2000 and 2004 respectively. The family moved to Battle Ground, WA in 2003 where they called their small farm home for over 18 years.

Don loved fishing, flying his airplane, drinking good coffee, playing guitar and ukulele, the outdoors, riding horses, snowboarding, animals big and small, SCU-BA diving and snorkeling, gardening, skateboarding, boating, stargazing, and spending time on tropical beaches with his family. He volunteered in his children's schools and coached youth soccer and baseball. He was a skilled mechanic, hard worker, and true jack of all trades — always ready to help those in need.

Don served his community as a law enforcement officer for the Gresham Police Department, Port of Portland Police Department, and most recently the Vancouver Police Department. Throughout his career, he specialized as a "Beat the Heat Racing" leader, SWAT team member, child abuse and homicide detective, air support member, EVOC instructor, surveillance team member, field training officer, armorer, training manager, and mentor to many. His goal was always to make his community a safer place, and he loved working toward that goal with his law enforcement family.

Don is survived by his wife, Dawnese Sahota, and two children, Kylie DaCunha and Colton Sahota; all who will miss him dearly.
